# **Synopsis**

The play opens as an actor enters the stage sipping a drink. He moves along the apron from woman to woman sitting in the Audience. He smiles at one, makes goo-goo eyes at another as if he was about to pick one up.

"Is love real? Or is it just another lie? A fairy tale we invented in the desperation of our lonely, empty lives?"

Clearly he's looking for a lady. A very special lady. One who's not afraid to tell the truth.

"Is there an honest woman in the house? I don't know you. You don't know me! After tonight we'll never see each again. What have we to hide?

The honest woman turns out to be Jane. They have a drink and talk honestly about themselves and their failed marriages. The more they find out about each other, the more they learn about themselves. They often speak to the audience, as they each attempt to enlist its support.

Are they married? Are they playing some kind of game? In this comedy Tarzan and Jane explore their relationship from five different angles in five different acts. Five little plays. Five pieces of the same puzzle.
